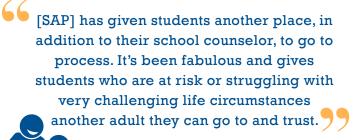

Schoolwide **Activities** (e.g., policies)

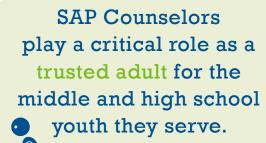
