### Teen & Young Adult Drug and Alcohol Use

#### DATA:

Young Adult WELL VISITS lower percentage than other WC visits \* SUD/OD(Pract.most concerned w/Fent.

(31 % =18-21 years (Medicaid) VS 75.6% Nationwide (NSCH)

(Age 19-21 Highest of combined overdoses)

• HOMELESSNESS in young adults

\* ALCOHOL

(Youth make up 34 % of Homeless in NH)

(15% of underage drinkers began before age 13-SAMHSA)

• FOOD INSECURITY

(7 mil people 12-20 Reported drinking in last month-NIH)

(Some Counties in NH have one of the highest food insecurity rates among youth (1 in 6)
