

New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services Therapeutic Cannabis Program 2016 Data Report

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Introduction

Pursuant to RSA 126-X:10, the Commissioner of the Department of Health and Human Services shall report annually on the Therapeutic Cannabis Program established under RSA 126-X. The report shall be made to the NH Health and Human Services Oversight Committee established under RSA 126-A:13, the NH Board of Medicine, and the NH Board of Nursing.

The report shall allow for identification of patterns of certification by qualifying patient and designated caregiver, location, age, medical condition, symptom or side effect, and medical provider, and for analysis and research to inform future policy, educational, and clinical decisions.

The report shall contain, at a minimum, the following data:

- (a) The number of designated caregivers and the number of qualifying patients, by town or city and county.
- (b) The ages of the qualifying patients and the ages of the designated caregivers.
- (c) The qualifying medical conditions and the number of each qualifying medical condition.
- (d) The qualifying symptoms or side effects and the number of each symptom or side effect.
- (e) The number of physicians and the number of advanced practice registered nurses issuing written certifications.
- (f) The number of providers in each medical specialty issuing written certifications.
- (g) Any other issues related to the therapeutic use of cannabis permitted under this chapter that the health and human services oversight committee shall request.

In addition, the report shall contain a summary of the report submitted by each alternative treatment center as required under RSA 126-X:8, XII, and NH Administrative Rule He-C 402.10(q).

Therapeutic Cannabis Program Registry Data

The data presented in this section reflects current (active) data in the Therapeutic Cannabis Program Registry Database as of December 19, 2016. In order to protect the confidentiality of qualifying patients and designated caregivers, where fewer than five individuals are affected with regard to city or town the number of individuals has not been published.
