## **New Hampshire J1 Visa Waiver Report**

The data shown below represents how many J1 Visa Waiver (Conrad 30) slots were used by type. The data is reported by Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) which is October 1-Sept. 30 of each year shown.

Total Slots Used – Each state is allotted 30 J1 Visa Waiver slots per FFY, with a maximum of 10 of them being allowed to be used as Flex Slots.

Flex Slots Used – J1 Visa Waiver physicians whose practice sites are located outside of federally designated shortage areas, but are serving patients from those shortage areas, require the use of a Flex Slot.

Non-Flex Slots – J1 Visa Waiver physicians whose practice sites are located in federally designated shortage areas do not require a Flex Slot. If they are providing services at more than one practice site and any of the sites is outside a federally designated shortage area, then a Flex Slot is required.

*Primary Care* – J1 Visa Waiver physicians whose services are considered *primary care* (Family Practice, Pediatrics, ObGyn, Internal Medicine, Psychiatry, Hospitalists).

Specialists – J1 Visa Waiver physicians whose services are considered a specialty (Geriatrics, General Surgeons, Pulmonary/Critical Care, Hematology/Oncology, etc.) (some sub-specialties accepted if the facility can demonstrate that a shortage of that specialty exists in that service area).
