Your Hot Tub/Spa and Legionella



Legionella are bacteria that can cause a serious lung infection called Legionnaires' disease. *Legionella* bacteria grow naturally in water and especially in warm water.



Hot tubs that are not cleaned and disinfected properly can become contaminated with *Legionella*. People can get infected with *Legionella* if they inhale steam or mist from a contaminated hot tub.

Make sure your hot tub is maintained and properly disinfected

To prevent the growth and spread of bacteria like *Legionella* in your hot tub, perform these activities regularly:

- □ Check disinfectant and pH levels

- □ **Remove slime or biofilm** by scrubbing and cleaning
- □ Replace the hot tub water filter according to manufacturer's recommendations
- □ Replace the hot tub water
