



ADDENDUM #2 RFP # 16-DHHS-OCOM-MAC-01

On December 4, 2015, the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services published a request for proposals, soliciting proposals from agencies currently funded to provide Regional Public Health Network services who can provide substance use disorder (SUD) treatment, residential and/or supportive housing, and wraparound services to pregnant and/or parenting women.

The Department is publishing this addendum to:

1. Delete and replace Section 1.1, Purpose and Overview with the following:

1.1 Purpose and Overview

This Request for Proposals is published to solicit proposals from agencies currently funded to provide Regional Public Health Network services who can provide substance use disorder (SUD) treatment, residential and/or supportive housing, and wraparound services to pregnant and/or parenting women who:

- Are experiencing substance use disorders;
- Have income at or below the 185% Federal Poverty Level; and
- Are homeless, or at risk of becoming homeless.

Agencies that are currently funded to provide Regional Public Health Network services may submit proposals that include subcontracting relationship(s) with partnering agencies that possess the skills, knowledge and capacity to complete the required activities.

Proposals must expand current services, provide new beds, or increase services that are available. Funds for this project cannot supplant services currently available.

Vendors must demonstrate an understanding of providing trauma informed services with culturally informed supports. The selected vendor(s) must either be or become enrolled as a Medicaid provider, as services provided to the covered population must be billed to Medicaid first.

The Department is seeking a vendor who can provide pregnant and/or parenting women with access to services/functions/items, which *may* include but are not limited to:

- Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Residential Treatment Services.
- Outpatient SUD Treatment with Supportive Housing Services.
- Outpatient SUD Treatment with Housing Stabilization Services.

- Clinical staff to oversee treatment 24 hours per day/7 days per week.
- Access to on- and/or off-site age developmentally appropriate childcare.
- Transportation services to and from non-medical services.
- Wraparound services.
- Case management.
