


Tutoring at New Hampshire Hospital

Children are typically
admitted to
New Hampshire Hospital
(NHH) when they are
having problems with how
they are thinking, feeling
and/or behaving. The
hospital's goal is to use its
team of Child and
Adolescent experts to
skillfully care for and help
each child return home as
quickly as possible.

School is an important part of
every young person's life. In
order to help each child
retain the academic skills
they entered the
hospital with, NHH offers the
hospital based tutoring
services described in this
brochure.



Information about academics for hospitalized patients



When a child is admitted to NHH, every parent is asked to sign an authorization to the school granting the school permission to disclose academic information to the hospital. The authorization allows the NHH Educational Liaison to directly contact the child's school for the purpose of treatment planning and providing tutoring services.



When the Educational Liaison contacts the school, the school will be asked for the following information:

- The Individual Education Plan (IEP)
- The 504 Accommodation Plan
- The results of recent testing
- General academic, behavioral and social information about the child
- The child's teacher's name

The Educational Liaison will remain in contact with the child's school and will arrange to have the child tutored at NHH as soon as the child is able to participate in tutoring services. Any one of the following are examples of how tutoring services can be delivered:

- The school may send someone from their school or a tutor from a local company to NHH to work with the student. A school may choose to utilize the tutor assigned to NHH, who is a certified teacher.
- Packets of schoolwork may be sent to the student to complete
- The school may request that the student have internet access to complete lessons online
- The student may attend their school during the day and return to NHH at night

In addition, a certified teacher is available to children and adolescents at NHH during room time to help with their schoolwork.



The Educational Liaison may also coordinate services for:

- Adults who are between 18 and 21 and still receiving education as part of their Individual Education Plan (IEP)
- Individuals on Extended School Year programs
- Individuals interested in obtaining a GED
- Students involved with Project Renew.

Tutoring sessions may take place on the:

- patient unit
- visitors rooms
- in the library

Computers and a laptop are available for tutoring sessions.
