During the summer months seniors participating in CSFP are eligible to receive free fruits and vegetables that are delivered directly to the CSFP site they shop at or where they receive their food boxes.

Seniors will receive one “bundle” for the summer to increase the amount of fresh fruits and vegetables they eat. Ask for more information at your CSFP agency.



Are you a senior 60 years or older looking for help to stretch your food budget?

CSFP can help you by providing healthy foods to supplement your food budget. The value of the food you receive is approximately \$50.00 per month.



Foods provided may include:

- Milk—shelf stable milk
- Non-fat dry milk
- Peanut Butter
- Rice and Pasta
- Cereal
- Cheese
- Canned Fruits
- Canned Vegetables - low sodium
- Canned Meat, Poultry or Fish
- 100% Juice



How to Sign Up

Call your CSFP local agency listed on this brochure to make an appointment.

At your first appointment you will need to bring:

- ✓ Proof of Income
- ✓ Proof of Residence
- ✓ Picture ID
- ✓ Proof of Date of Birth

You have several choices for how to pick up your CSFP boxes.

1. If you live near Concord, Manchester, or Nashua, you may come to shop at the CSFP warehouse for your food.
2. CSFP foods are delivered at many sites in NH, such as churches, senior centers, senior housing, community buildings and other sites.
3. If you need to send a family member because you can not go yourself, they may be your “proxy” and will need a note from you to pick up your foods.
