Integrating Additional Groups into Medicaid Care Management for Their Medical Services

► **Meet the Health Plans** ► **Ask Questions**

On Thursday, August 6, the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), New Hampshire Healthy Families, and the Well Sense Health Plan will hold a public information session for Medicaid recipients and providers to inform them about mandatory enrollment into Medicaid Care Management for medical services. Medicaid recipients who were able to opt out of Medicaid Care Management will be required to pick one of the two health plans for their medical services; coverage will begin in the Fall, 2015.

Recipients in the following groups will now be required to enroll in Medicaid Care Management:

- Children under 19 who are: receiving Supplemental Security Income (SSI), have Home Care for Children with Severe Disabilities (also known as Katie Beckett), or are receiving services through Special Medical Services or Partners in Health. The group also includes children in foster care or other out-of-home placement, or receiving foster care or adoption assistance.
- Recipients of any age who are eligible for both Medicare and Medicaid (known as dually eligible).

We encourage you to attend this session to get answers to your questions about the health plans, including:

- Transition of Care from Fee-for-Service to a Health Plan
- Care Coordination available under the Health Plans
- The prior authorization (PA) process
