

**Introduction:**

He-P 806 sets forth the licensing requirements for non-emergency walk-in care centers (NEWCC), whether stationary or mobile, pursuant to RSA 151:2, I(d). Groups affected by this rule include any legal entity operating a NEWCC pursuant to RSA 151:2, I(d). The proposed rule adopts, readopts, and readopts with amendment He-P 806.

This proposal was published in the December 23, 2023, Rulemaking Register. The Department held a public hearing on Thursday, February 1, 2024 with one member of the public in attendance. That one member opted to provide minimal testimony at that time which has been summarized in the below table. The Department did not receive any additional testimony within the public comment period.
