





## Appendix G, Target Population Data for: Community-Based Voluntary Services (RFP-2021-DCYF-03-COMMU)

**Graph 1.** Of all families assessed in SFY19, 2,195 were assessed to be at high or very-high risk of subsequent DCYF involvement and *did not* have a court finding (blue box). This group comprises our ‘target population’.




**Graph 2.** Of the 2,195 families in the target population, a significant share (46%) of families had past or present substance use identified during their CPS assessment.





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**Graph 3.** Of the 2,195 families in the target population, a significant share (61%) had one or two risk factors identified during their CPS assessment; 28% had zero of the risk factors identified (see Graph 2).



**Graph 4.** Of the 2,195 families in the target population, 39% have multiple children across age groups; 51% have at least one young child.





**Graph 5.** Of the 2,195 families in the target population, 45% of primary caregivers were between 26 and 35 years old with a median age of 34.




**Graph 6.** Of the 2,195 families in the target population, 67% of families had either 1 or 2 children.




