*WHEREAS*, through the tireless efforts of recovery coaches and recovery community centers across New Hampshire, people suffering from addiction have been able to find and sustain a life in recovery; and

*WHEREAS*, people in recovery have courageously shared their experiences in order to show those suffering from substance use disorder that there is hope and that recovery is possible; and

*WHEREAS*, New Hampshire is working through state and community partners to find the best strategies to ensure a pathway to recovery for those in need, and acknowledges that more work needs to be done; and

*WHEREAS*, September will be Recovery Month in New Hampshire to reaffirm our commitment to finding long-term and comprehensive ways to ensure a resilient and recovery-centered system of care that is accessible for the citizens of New Hampshire in need of support;
