


# Unduplicated Open Cases - Economic Assistance

# Pandemic – EBT

Pandemic – EBT (P-EBT) is a program for SNAP and non-SNAP households.

Under P-EBT children eligible for free or reduced price meals under the National School Lunch Program are eligible to receive a monthly benefit for the period covering mid-March through mid-June.



Access to the program is through the five (5) Community Action Program agencies located throughout the state.




# Child Care Recovery and Stabilization

- 604 programs representing Licensed and License – Exempt Center-Based Programs, Day Camps, Family Child Care Providers have been awarded funding;
- \$16,584,500 is currently being distributed
- This enables approximately 43,074 licensed or allowable capacity spaces across the state.




# Bureau of Child Support Services – Support Orders
