

# MONOCLONAL ANTIBODY INFUSION LOCATIONS

for Persons Who Have Contracted COVID-19 and are At-Risk of Severe Outcomes



## STEP 1:

If you test positive for COVID-19, contact your Primary Care Provider to determine if you are at high risk of severe outcomes and eligible for monoclonal antibody treatment. If you do not have a primary care provider, you may contact ConvenientMD or other health providers. If you require emergency care, you may be seen in person at an emergency room.

## Step 2:

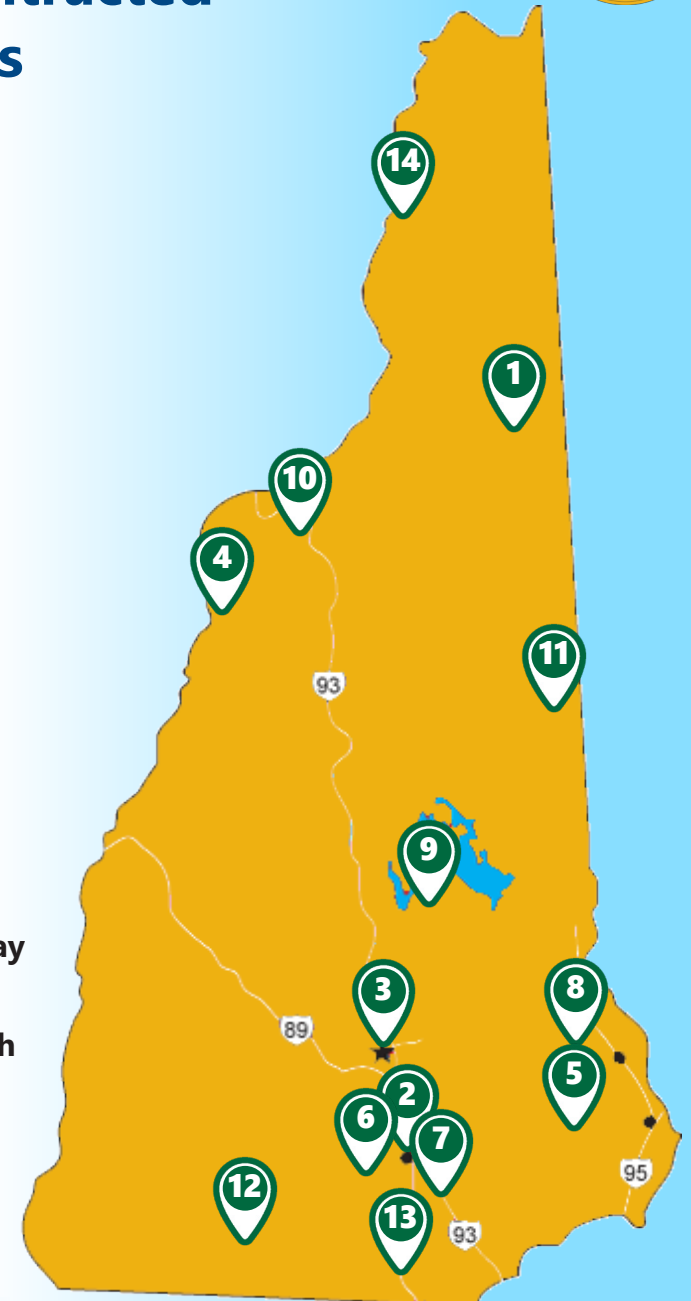
If your healthcare provider determines you are eligible for the treatment, they will contact a Monoclonal Antibody Infusion Site to request an infusion appointment.

## Step 3:

The Monoclonal Antibody Infusion Site will contact you. If it is determined you meet clinical criteria, the site will provide specific instructions on your appointment.
