

NEW HAMPSHIRE RYAN WHITE CARE PROGRAM

Federal money is available through the N.H. Division of Public Health Department of Health and Human Services to assist people with HIV/AIDS in obtaining HIV/AIDS-related drugs, prescription drugs and other healthcare services. Applicants must meet financial and medical qualification guidelines. The program is the payer of last resort for individuals living below 300% of the federal poverty level. Insurance premium payment and co-pay assistance are available for those with insurance and who do not qualify for Medicaid; or whose health insurance doesn't cover drug reimbursement. NEW HAMPSHIRE STD/HIV/VIRAL HEPATITIS SECTION

The NH STD/HIV/Viral Hepatitis Section includes the HIV Prevention Program, STD Prevention Program, Viral Hepatitis Program and Ryan White CARE Act Part B Program. The Section receives funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to develop and administer these programs.

ARS provides direct assistance to individuals and families infected with and affected by HIV/AIDS through case management services available free to every client. Case managers

work with clients to assist in the coordination of needed medical and social services, provide linkage to other area agencies and help in organizing a care plan. In addition, ARS offers free, confidential testing for HIV and STDs, as well as hepatitis screening and vaccination against hepatitis A and B directly or by referral.

The Southern NH HIV/AIDS Task Force is a non-profit AIDS Service organization providing comprehensive care, support and education services in southern NH. The Client Services Team provides comprehensive case management services in English and Spanish to individuals and families living with HIV/AIDS.

Additional services include housing/utility assistance, client advocacy, respite care, mental health/substance abuse counseling, nutritional counseling and supplements, food pantry, transportation assistance, peer support and support groups. Some services require residency in certain towns or counties and a case manager can assist in determining eligibility.

Additionally the Task Force provides several education and prevention programs including workshops targeting gay/bisexual men, youth at risk, people in the workplace and individuals at high risk for acquiring/transmitting HIV and HCV. General education on transmission and disease progression is available to agency clients, families and the general community including school-based and corporate presentations. OraSure HIV Testing is available for partners/spouses of people living with HIV, as is prevention case management. A Latina health education program provides general women's health information including HIV, in small group settings in Greater Nashua.

ALCOHOL & DRUG TREATMENT SERVICES

Crisis Centers/Residential Detoxification

Clinically managed residential detoxification services are for individuals who are experiencing intoxication from alcohol and/or drug use but are not a medical emergency. Programs are staffed by Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) as well as paid and volunteer staff trained in the management of the inebriated or impaired person.

Programs provide short-term residential services including individual and group counseling, educational sessions and introduction to self-help groups. The purpose of the programs is to provide a safe and supportive environment until appropriate treatment becomes available. They are typically available 24 hours a day / 7 days a week.

Outpatient Treatment

The NH Division of Alcohol Tobacco and Other Drug Services contracts with agencies to provide outpatient substance abuse counseling, assessment and screening. These programs serve individuals whose alcohol and drug use affects their daily living and causes family issues, irregular employment, arrest, etc. In many cases an individual's outpatient counselor provides the first step towards comprehensive treatment. RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT

Low Intensity Residential Treatment

Clinically Managed Low Intensity (CMLI) Residential Treatment Programs are designed to provide short-term supportive services to the recovering alcoholic/addict. The goal is to prepare residents for self-sufficiency in the community. To be eligible for most CMLI programs, a client must have already completed a residential program and/or experienced a minimum period of sobriety.

Medium Intensity Residential Treatment

Clinically Managed Medium Intensity (CMMI) Residential Treatments Services (also known as Residential Post-Detoxification Programs) are designed to assist those clients who have been substance free for a minimum of 72 hours. Admission is on a voluntary basis. The length of stay averages 28 – 30 days and costs vary on a sliding fee scale basis.

High Intensity Residential Treatment

Clinically Managed High Intensity (CMHI) Residential Treatment Programs are designed for clients with severe substance abuse problems. People referred to a high intensity programs are generally experiencing serious problems functioning in the community. Admission is voluntary and the length of stay varies from three months to a year, depending on the needs of the client.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES DISTRICT OFFICES

Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) District Offices are regional extensions of DHHS. District Offices provide information about and applications for a variety of state supplement programs, including: Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled (APTD), Medical Assistance Program (MEDICAID), Food Stamp Program (FSP), Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) and Old Age Assistance (OAA). Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF)

In NH, Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) provides temporary financial and medical assistance to families with dependent children. To qualify, the dependent children must lack parental support or care due to death, continued absence, or because one or both parents in a two-parent home are disabled, unemployed, or working less than 100 hours a month. Parents of families eligible for Financial Assistance to Needy Families are also eligible for Medicaid and children are eligible for Healthy Kids Gold medical coverage. Families eligible for TANF are also eligible for Emergency Assistance program services that can help them get and keep safe and secure housing. Applications for this program are available at the local N.H. Department of Health and Human Services District Offices.

Local Welfare

Each town, city and county in N.H. administers its own relief programs. Assistance is usually in the form of vouchers paid directly to vendors for goods and services (e.g., food, rent, heat, utilities). Larger towns and cities often have full-time offices with regular business hours. Check under "Government, City/Town" for phone numbers. (In smaller towns, contact the Town Office for more details.) Cities/Towns are required by law to provide assistance to people who live within their jurisdiction when: 1) no other means of support is present; 2) temporary assistance is required; or 3) a person's basic needs exceed his/her customary income.

Food Stamp Program

The Food Stamp Program provides assistance so that eligible households can eat nutritious foods and maintain good health. The assistance is provided in the form of a plastic card called an Electronic Benefits Transfer card or EBT card. The EBT card looks like a credit card so only you and the cashier know what type of card you are using.

Some important things to know about Food Stamps are that:

- You CAN have a job
- You CAN own your own home
- You CAN own your own car
- You CAN be a single person
- You CAN have an interview over the phone
- You do NOT have to have children
- You do NOT have to have a permanent home
- You do NOT have to go to a District Office to apply
- You do NOT need to pay Food Stamps back

Applicants will need to provide some verification. These include things like identity, residence, income, shelter and utility costs, medical expenses, resources and the like.

Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled (APTD)

The Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled (APTD) program offers the physically and/or mentally disabled individual (between 18 – 64) financial and medical assistance. Eligibility criteria are based on income, assets, and expenses at the time of the application. All persons living with HIV disease are eligible provided they meet the criteria. *Note: Financial criteria changes throughout the fiscal year. Persons interested in determining the most recent figures should call the N.H. Department of Health and Human Services District Office nearest them.*

Medical Assistance Program (MEDICAID)

For individuals who meet the technical and categorical requirements of either the TANF or APTD programs, the Medicaid program pays for some healthcare costs (e.g., doctor and hospital bills, prescriptions, dental care for children) up to the program's limits. If a person meets all other requirements but is over the income limit, Medicaid can provide coverage after the person spends down the amount stipulated under its In-and-Out Program. For information, call your local DHHS District Office.

AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP)

Federal money is available through the N.H. Division of Public Health Services to assist people with HIV/AIDS in obtaining HIV/AIDS-related drugs. Applicants must meet financial and medical qualification guidelines. The program is for individuals who do not qualify for Medicaid or whose health insurance doesn't cover drug reimbursement. For information and application forms call the N.H. STD/HIV/Viral Hepatitis Program at (800) 852-3345 ext. 4502.

Home- and Community-Based Care Services

The AIDS Home Care Program is a federal grant subsidy that provides assistance to low-income, medically needy persons with HIV/AIDS who are either medically or chronically dependent. The following services and items can be provided:

- ◆ Durable medical equipment
- ◆ Homemaker/home health aide services and personal care services in the individual's home, including respite care
- ◆ Day treatment or partial hospitalization
- ◆ Home intravenous (IV) therapy, including IV-prescription drugs and monitoring by skilled nursing personnel
- ◆ Routine diagnostic tests administered in the home

Payments are made directly to the provider on behalf of the client. For more information and application forms, contact the N.H. DPHS, Bureau of Special Medical Services at 271-4488 or (800) 852-3345 ext. 4488.

Social Security (SS)

All people living with a disability can apply for Social Security benefits:

Supplemental Security Income (SSI) covers those who meet low-income and resource criteria. These criteria require that the applicant's resources (i.e., things owned such as real estate, personal belongings, cash and bank accounts) as well as income are below certain levels.

Social Security Disability (SSD) covers those who have paid FICA or self-employment taxes. Payments are not based on need but rather on the

monies contributed to the FICA or self-employment fund. Benefits can only be made after onset of disability and the amount of the benefit depends on how long a person worked and how much was earned. You can apply for either program by telephone using the Teleservice System at (800) 772-1213. **(Note:** You must provide any claim number under which you have received or are receiving benefits (i.e. VA or welfare number). NH COMMUNITY ACTION PROGRAMS

Local Community Action Program (CAP) offices are designated as field registration sites for a variety of assistance programs including but not limited to: energy assistance, fuel assistance, family support, nutrition services and transportation services. (Services may vary between CAP offices). The CAP offices accept applications and determine eligibility and benefit levels.

STATE HEALTH PROGRAMS

Each year thousands of New Hampshire families benefit from a variety of preventative health care and education services available throughout the state. Many of these services are offered either directly through the NH Division of Public Health Services (DPHS) or through a contract with local health agencies. Emphasis is placed on providing services to people who do not have access to medical services. This section briefly describes health care programs offered by the NH DPHS. Primary Care Centers

The Department of Health and Human Services, Bureau of Maternal and Child Health contracts with community health agencies located throughout New Hampshire to provide primary health care services. Staffed with family physicians, nurse practitioners, social service providers, nutritionists and other health professionals, these centers provide the full range of primary care for all members of the family. Primary care or Community Health Centers accept most forms of health insurance and offer a sliding fee scale based on income for uninsured clients. No one is turned away due to inability to pay. *Services include:*

- ◆ Preventive health care
- ◆ Medical care for acute and chronic illnesses
- ◆ Hospital care
- ◆ Well Child care
- ◆ Family planning
- ◆ Prenatal care and management of labor and delivery
- ◆ Geriatric health care
- ◆ Coordination of social, mental health and medical services for the individual or family

Child Health Programs

Child Health Programs throughout the state offer preventive health care services for healthy children ages newborn to six-years old. Local home health care organizations operate these programs with partial funding from the Bureau of Maternal and Child Health. Family Planning Program

The Family Planning Program (FPP) provides educational and clinical services to help individuals maintain their reproductive health and to prevent unintended pregnancies. The program has a special emphasis on serving low-income men, women and teens. FPP is a part of Maternal and Child Health. FPP services are provided by community agencies statewide. Specific services provided are listed below.

- Comprehensive, high quality reproductive health care including routine exams, screening for sexually transmitted infections and a wide range of contraceptive methods
- Pregnancy testing and counseling
- Community education on reproductive health and sexuality

Teen Clinics

A network of Teen Reproductive Health Clinics meets the special needs of young people with after-school hours of operation and teen-friendly waiting rooms and staff. At these clinics informed peer educators provide information and support. Teens are encouraged to explore ways of engaging in open communications with their parents and have the opportunity to build critical thinking skills. Prenatal Program

The Prenatal Program provides funding to 12 community health agencies to provide prenatal care to low income, uninsured and underinsured pregnant women. Prenatal services include:

- Prenatal and post-partum visits
- Voluntary HIV testing
- Health education
- Nutrition services
- Social services
- Smoking cessation counseling, and
- Home visiting

DHHS Bureau of Infectious Disease Control: Tuberculosis Program

The goal of the New Hampshire Tuberculosis (TB) Program is to eliminate tuberculosis by:

- Identification and treatment of persons who have TB disease
- Preventing the spread of disease to others
- Finding, screening & treating persons exposed to those with disease
- Targeting screening and treatment to populations at high-risk for TB infection and disease

The TB Program works in collaboration with health care providers, the Manchester and Nashua city health departments and community agencies to conduct surveillance, screening, treatment and containment activities for TB disease and Latent TB Infection (LTBI). For disease reporting or more information contact: 603-271-4496 (M-F 8:00 a.m.- 4:30 p.m). For emergency assistance during non-business hours, 603-271-5300 and ask for the public health professional on call.

Women, Infants and Children Program (WIC)

The WIC Program offers supplemental, nutritious foods to pregnant and breastfeeding women and children up to age five. Program recipients must be determined to be at nutritional risk due to a medical condition or a dietary inadequacy that affects their nutritional status. The Bureau of WIC Nutrition Services operates the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP), that provides both surplus and federally purchased commodity foods to income-eligible households. HIV-infected pregnant women may be eligible for WIC if they meet the income criteria. The process requires that a hearing officer listen to the complainant's points of dissatisfaction along with and description of the action that has been taken, and then takes appropriate action. 
