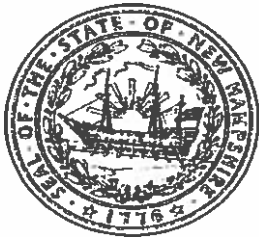


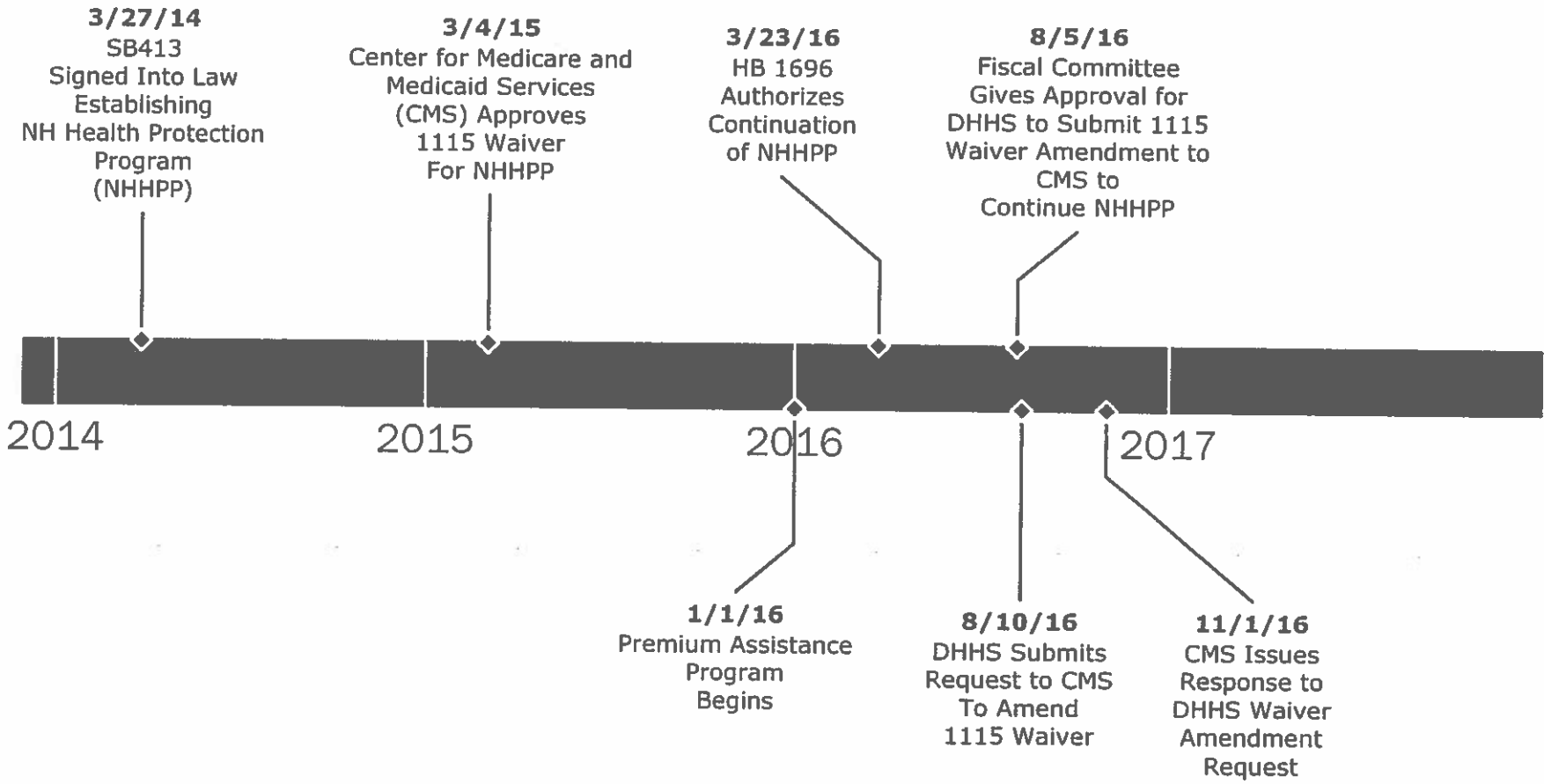

# Timeline



## Who can Enroll in the Premium Assistance Program?



- Between ages 19-64
- Income below 138% Federal poverty level (FPL)
- Not pregnant at time of eligibility determination\*
- Not entitled to or enrolled in Medicare
- Not in any other mandatory Medicaid eligibility group

**✘** Except adults who self-identify as medically frail:

Individuals who self-identify as being medically frail do not stay in the Premium Assistance Program. Instead, they receive their health coverage through the state's Managed Care program.

*\*Individuals are treated as "not pregnant" unless they attest to being pregnant on their enrollment application*

10 Essential Health Benefits (EHBs)



Vision and limited dental



Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT) for 19 and 20 year olds



Non-emergency medical transportation



In-network Federally Qualified Health Centers



Free access to family planning services and providers

Prescription drugs

Rehabilitative and habilitative services and devices

Laboratory services

Hospitalization

Ambulatory patient services

Pediatric services, including oral and vision care

Maternity and newborn care

Mental health and substance use disorder services

Preventive and wellness services and chronic disease management

Emergency services

**PAP enrollees are eligible for NH Medicaid “wrap” benefits, including:**

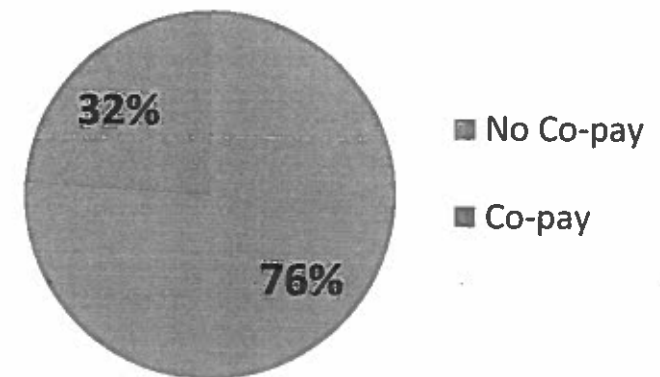
Wrap Services	Description
<b>Transportation</b>	Access transportation to and from medical appointments if the enrollee has no other way of getting there
<b>Additional Support for Age 19-20 Year Olds</b>	Eligible to receive additional benefits if provider prescribes them as medically necessary. This standard of benefit is called Early Periodic Screening Diagnostic and Testing Services (EPSDT)
<b>Family Planning Services and Supplies</b>	Family planning services and supplies from a Medicaid enrolled provider that is not in the QHP network, at no charge
<b>Limited Vision</b>	May be eligible for one pair of eyeglasses once a year if prescription changes enough
<b>Limited Dental</b>	Treatment for severe dental pain or dental infections.

To access wrap services, enrollees must present their NH Medicaid card when accessing services

## NHHPP Relative Income Levels

- The majority of NHHPP enrollees have income below the Federal Poverty Level. In 2016, for a household of 1, the federal poverty level is \$11, 770.
- Approximately 32 percent of current NHHPP enrollees have income above 100 percent of the Federal Poverty Level and are required to make copayments.

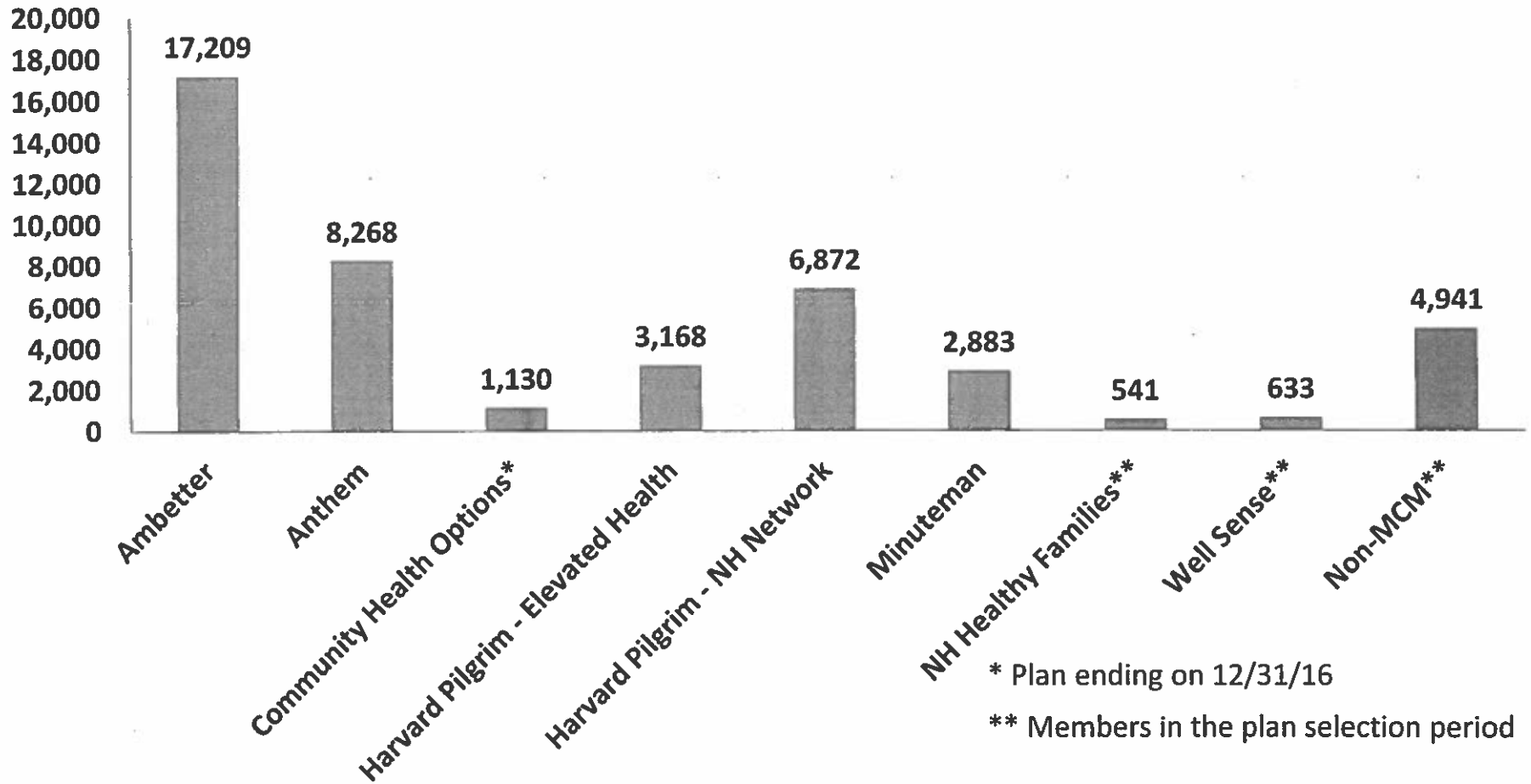

## PAP-eligible Plan Membership, 12/1/16

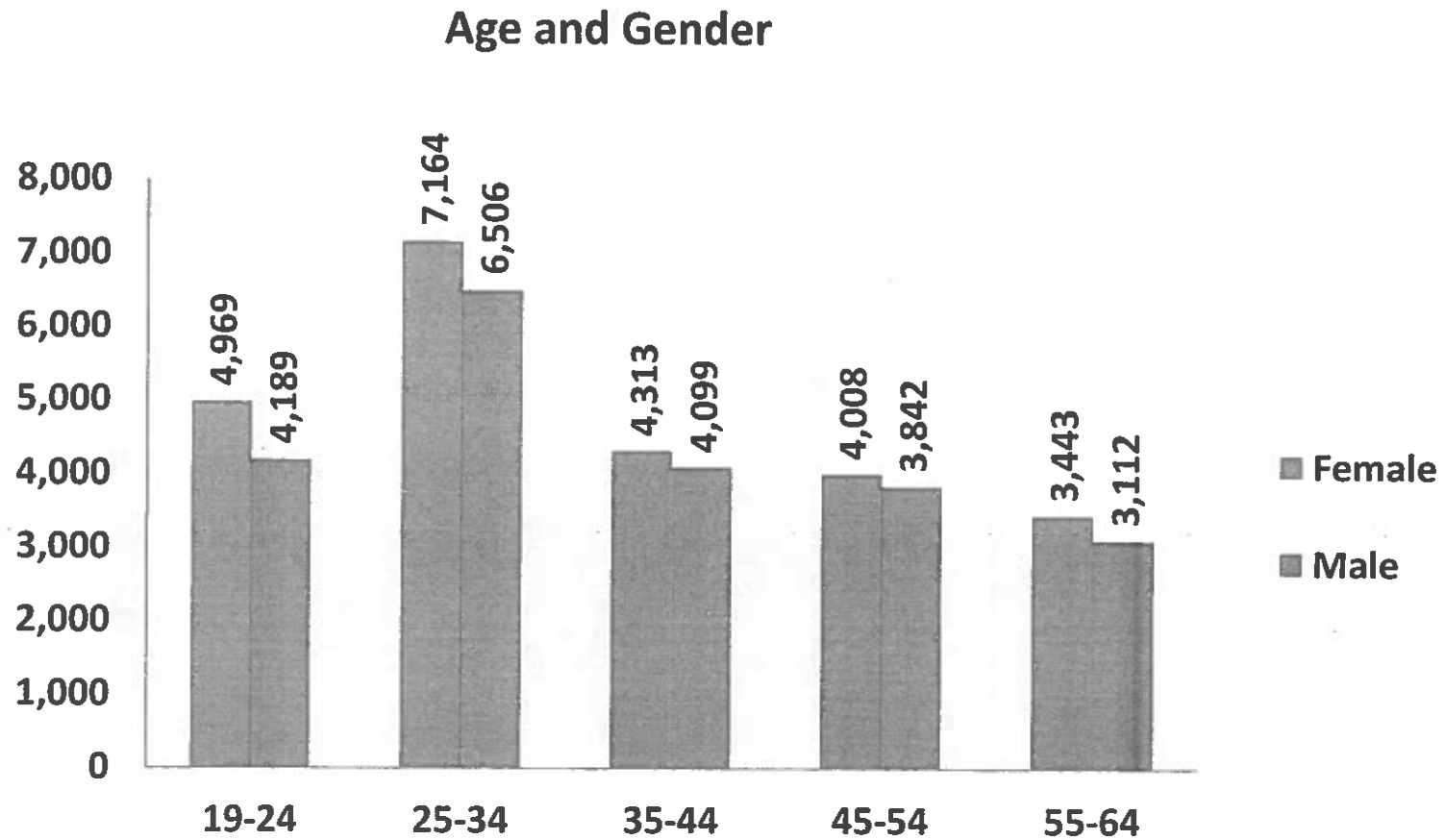

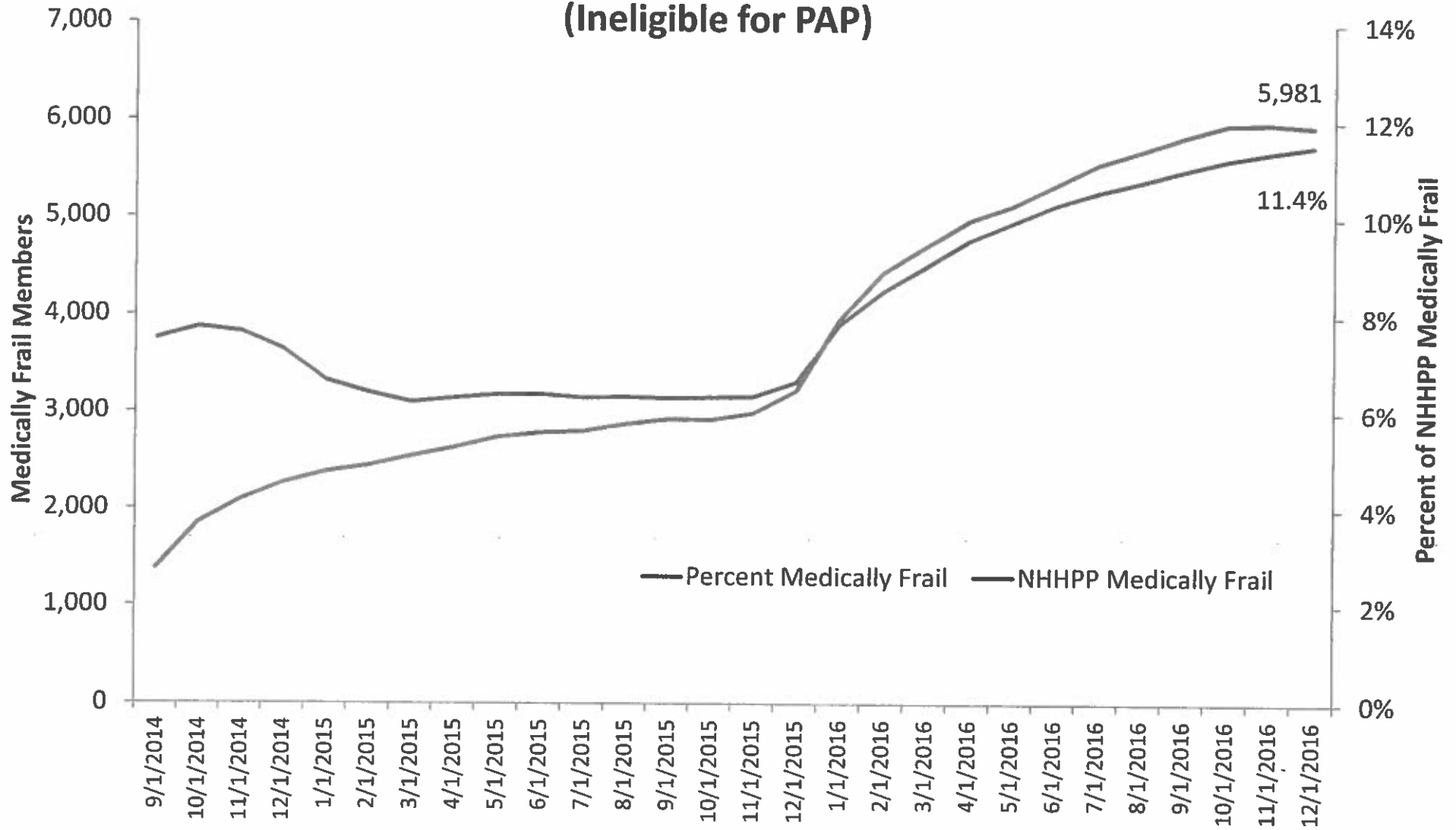


## Enrollees may self-identify as medically frail and enroll in a MCO plan

Medically frail enrollees have two MCO benefit plan options:

Health Benefit Differences	Medicaid Standard	Medicaid ABP
Access to long-term care services ( <i>e.g.</i> , nursing homes)	✓	✓
Help with everyday tasks, like bathing, getting dressed, and preparing meals	✓	✗
Services to help the enrollee stop using drugs or alcohol	✓	✓
Limits on the number of visits for some services, like care in a hospital outpatient clinic but there are no limits on emergency care, urgent care, or walk-in care	✓	✓

## Trend in NHHPP Designated Medically Frail (Ineligible for PAP)



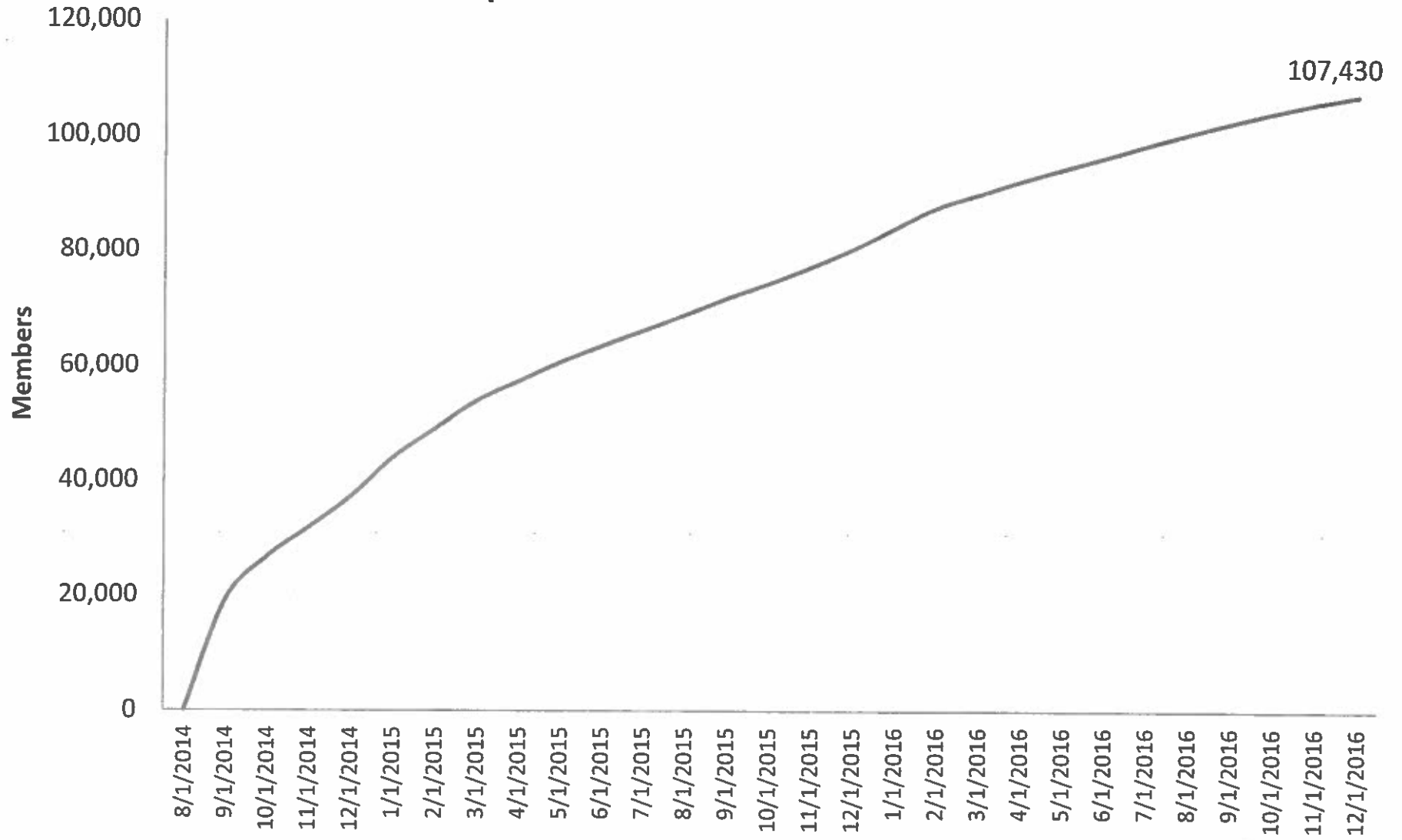

## Trend in Unique Individuals Ever Enrolled in NHHPP



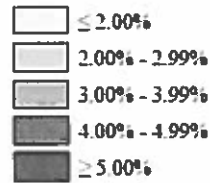

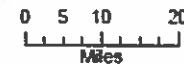

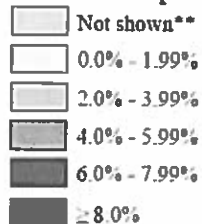

### Percent of Population\*



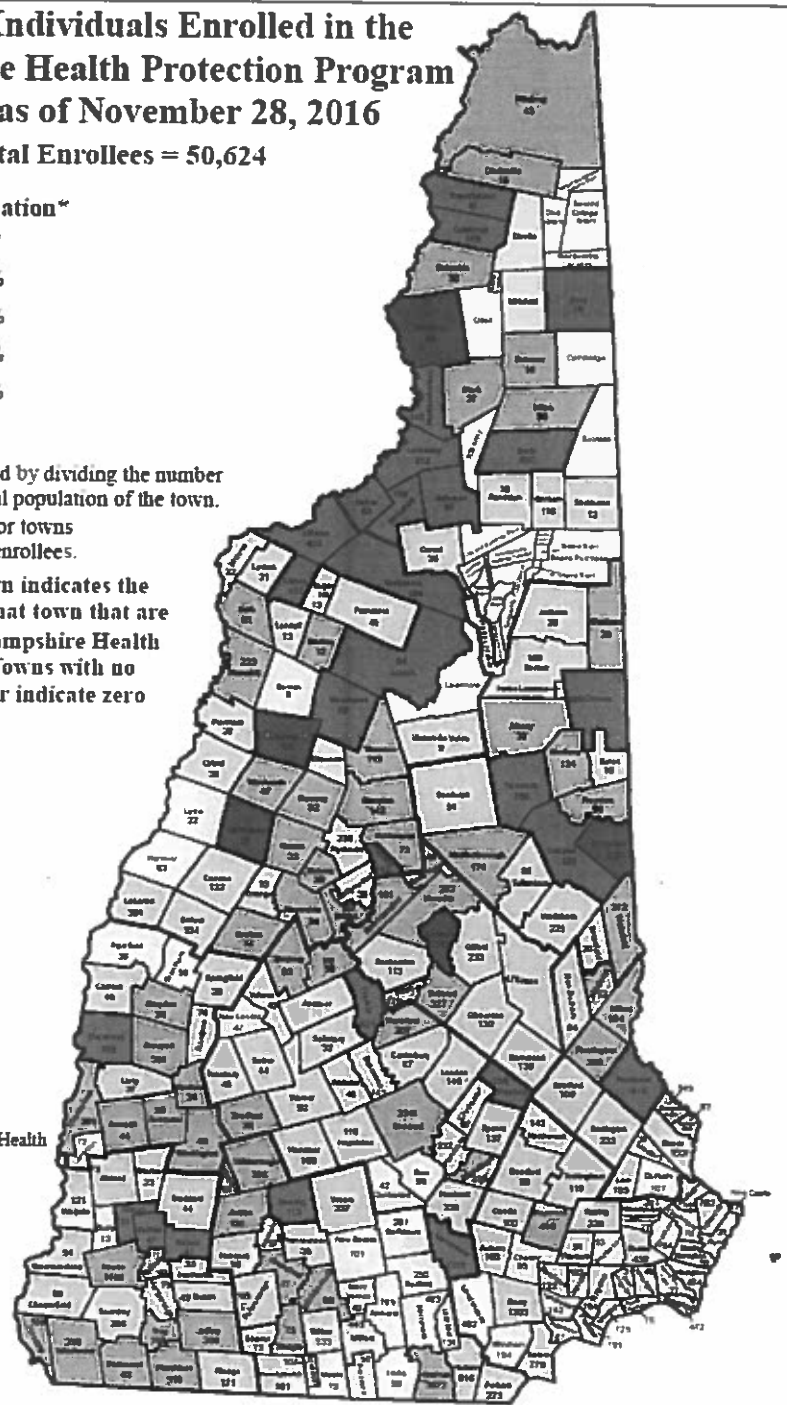
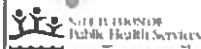
