Ryan White Legislation

In August 1990, Congress signed the Ryan White CARE Act, creating a system of services that greatly improved the quality and availability of health care services for people living with HIV and AIDS.

What is the NH CARE Program?

The Ryan White CARE Act (Comprehensive Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome Resources Emergency) aims to increase accessibility to health care and support services for persons living with the Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV).

The NH Division of Public Health Services receives funding to provide life-sustaining medications and to ensure quality clinical and case management services to New Hampshire residents who are infected with HIV and under 500% of the Federal Poverty Level.



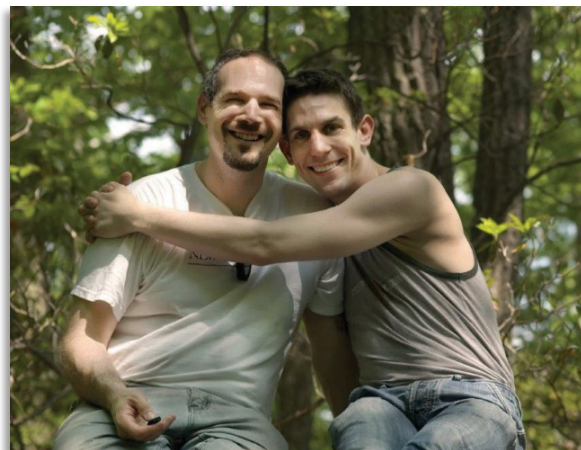
Am I eligible?

You are eligible if you are a resident of New Hampshire with HIV and meet the following financial requirement. Your annual gross household income must not exceed 500% of the 2020 Federal Poverty Level Guidelines.

500% of 2022 Federal Poverty Level Guidelines as of January 1, 2022

Household Size	Maximum Income
1	\$67,950
2	\$91,550
3	\$115,150
4	\$138,750
5	\$162,350
6	\$185,950
7	\$209,550
8	\$233,150
For each additional person add:	\$23,600

The NH CARE Program is the payer of last resort. This means if you are eligible for insurance, Medicare, or Medicaid, they must pay first.



How do I apply for enrollment?

Contact the NH CARE Program to be connected with a Case Management Agency near you.

Within 10 days of receipt of a completed enrollment, your Case Manager will be notified of your eligibility for the NH CARE Program.



Do I need to reapply?

Yes! If you qualify for NH CARE Program services, you are typically authorized for six months of services. At the end of the six-month enrollment period, your Case Manager will contact you to complete the re-enrollment process. Completing the re-enrollment process in a timely manner prevents disruption of benefits. Also, please notify your Case Manager if you move or get a new phone number.
