Did you know?

Some people are at greater risk of cervical cancer than others. Getting recommended Pap and Human papillomavirus (HPV) screening tests can help prevent cervical cancer, or catch and treat it in its early stages. Talk with a healthcare provider about which cervical cancer screening tests are right for you.

NH has among the lowest number of new cervical cancer diagnoses in the US, ranking 49th.¹

There were 11 cervical cancer deaths in NH in 2022.²

Each year about 39 NH women learn they have cervical cancer.³

78%

of NH women aged 21-65 have had a Pap test in the past 3 years.⁴



21st

NH has the 21st highest cervical cancer screening rate in the US.⁵



Most cervical cancers are found in the early stages (precancerous), when treatment is most effective.⁶

The 5-year survival rate for cervical cancer in NH is 62%.⁷
