ACHIEVEMENTS

- Partnership with the Concord Connections Coalition and the Early Childcare and Education Director's Roundtable.
- Hired new staff member with a focus in community engagement, collaboration, and communications.
- Worked with NAMI NH to support youth suicide prevention activities. Our efforts have been focused on cultivating an engaged youth suicide prevention implementation team and fostering more collaborative relationships with key stakeholders.
- Conducted numerous trainings on suicide prevention, including those for law enforcement officers, media recommendations and safe messaging, and online training.
- Attended the Youth Suicide Prevention Assembly meetings where we share case studies and relevant presentations.
- Supported the Concord Adverse Childhood Experiences Response Team for the past four years and secured grants to support this important community-level work.
- Received a three-year Trauma Responsive Community grant through New Hampshire Children's Health Foundation. We have partnered with Pear Associates to conduct an environmental scan.is.
