

# RADON MITIGATION RESOURCES NEW HAMPSHIRE

If your home has elevated radon levels, it is important to fix the problem. There are resources available to NH residents to fix health and safety problems in their homes, including radon problems. Learn about the available resources to see if you qualify.

### USDA Single Family Housing Repair Loans & Grants in New Hampshire

Also known as the Section 504 Home Repair Program, this program provides loans to low-income homeowners to repair, improve or modernize their homes or grants to elderly low-income homeowners to remove health and safety hazards. To be eligible you must:

- Be the homeowner and occupy the house.
- Be unable to obtain affordable credit elsewhere.
- Have a household income that does not exceed the limit by county.
- For grants, be age 62 or older and not be able to repay a repair loan.

#### FSA, HSA, or HRA

You may be able to use funds from a flexible spending account (FSA), health savings account (HSA), or a health reimbursement rearrangement (HRA) for radon mitigation if:

- A medical professional recommends radon mitigation because it is causing a medical condition from being in a home.
- A Letter of Medical Necessity (LMN) is provided.

## U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Homes Radon Testing and Mitigation

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) is developing a department-wide policy that identifies radon as a radioactive substance and addresses radon testing and mitigation requirements.
