Introduction

The 2023 Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) report presents data on health-risk behaviors of New Hampshire high school students by demographic characteristics. We hope this report is useful in understanding regional student behaviors and assists you in developing educational programs, curriculum and communication tools to encourage and support healthy behaviors among students in your communities.

State and Regional Estimates

State and regional estimates are calculated from a random sample developed using scientific survey methods¹. These methods use weighting to account for student, classroom, school, and regional factors in order to ensure the respondents are representative of students in the region and in the state. Surveys that have a sample selected according to CDC's randomization protocol, appropriate documentation of school and classroom selection, and an overall response rate of $\geq 60\%$ ² are weighted.
