

## **ADDENDUM #1**

RFA-2023-DCYF-01-RESTO Restorative Practices Training

(Changes are in **bold**, **underlined and italicized text** below to enable vendors to quickly recognize changes in paragraphs and/or wording.)

On October 6, 2022, the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services published a Request for Proposal, soliciting proposals from qualified Vendors to provide Restorative Practices trainings to community agencies, such as diversion programs external to the Department, and juvenile justice staff (JPPO's and Youth Counselors) internal to the Department.

The Department is publishing this addendum to:

- 1. Modify Section 2, Statement of Work, Subsection 2.1.1, with the following text:
  - 2.1.1 The selected Vendor must provide Restorative Practices Training to approximately eighty (80) individuals, including the Department's juvenile justice staff, and external diversion programs identified by the Department, to strengthen relationships between individuals as well as social connections within the community, including but not limited to:
    - 2.1.1.1 Improving the fidelity of effective practices;
    - 2.1.1.2 Strengthening the sustainability of implementation efforts; and
    - 2.1.1.3 Increasing the success of programs and practices.
