

ADDENDUM #1

RFA-2024-DES-03-OUTOF

Out-of-School Time Provider Support Services

(Changes are in **bold**, **underlined and italicized text** below to enable vendors to quickly recognize changes in paragraphs and/or wording.)

On May 3, 2023, the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services published a Request for Applications, soliciting responses to this Request for Applications (RFA) from qualified Vendors for the provision of services to retain and increase the statewide availability of quality out-of-school time child care. Services include:

- Training and Technical Assistance.
- · Capacity building activities.
- Workforce development activities.

The Department is publishing this addendum to:

- 1. Delete and replace Section 2., Statement of Work, Subsection 2.2., Training and Technical Assistance 2.2.1.2., with the following:
 - 2.2.1.2. Coordinating and conducting a minimum of seven (7), live or virtual, Listening Sessions with OST CCP in the seven (7) early childhood regions (see Appendix E- Child Care Access and Regional Systems Coordination).
 - 2.2.1.2.1. The Department defines a listening session as similar to a focus group and is a type of facilitated discussion, convened for the purpose of collecting information from a group of individuals in which the information is used to explore and inform new ideas and gather detailed feedback.

 Participants in a listening session are asked to talk about what they know and think and answer specific questions about a topic.
- 2. Delete and replace Section 2., Statement of Work, Subsection 2.2., Training and Technical Assistance 2.2.1.5., with the following:
 - 2.2.1.5. Conducting a literature review by reviewing national data to determine training and technical assistance needs for the OST CCP community. A literature review involves reviewing New Hampshire and national stakeholder reports, data, models and training programs to inform the best practices, trending and foundational training



<u>topics and successful training and technical assistance</u> <u>techniques.</u>

- 3. Delete and replace Section 2., Statement of Work, Subsection 2.2., Training and Technical Assistance 2.2.1.7., with the following:
 - 2.2.1.7. Providing culturally competent and responsive training to diverse language and cultural backgrounds to include:
 - <u>2.2.1.7.1.</u> Ensuring all staff are trained in cultural competence.
 - 2.2.1.7.2. Providing translation and interpretation services, in accordance with the selected Vendor(s)
 Culturally and Linguistically Appropriate Services (CLAS) Requirements.
 - **2.2.1.7.3.** Providing video remote option(s) for American Sign Language.
 - 2.2.1.7.4. Possessing knowledge and have an understanding of the cultural variations across the state to individualize services when necessary to meet the needs of each region (see <u>Appendix E</u> Child Care Access and Regional Systems Coordination).
- 4. Delete and replace Section 2., Statement of Work, Subsection 2.4., Workforce Development 2.4.3., with the following:
 - 2.4.3. The selected Vendor must establish and maintain relationships with the seven (7) Regional Leads for the purpose of promoting the importance of and access to OST CCP. <u>The seven (7) Regional Leads are identified below.</u>
 - 2.4.3.1. Region 1 (Greater Monadnock, Greater Sullivan & Upper County): Monadnock United Way.

Region 2 (Capital Area): Granite United Way (for the Capital region).

Region 3 (Greater Nashua): United Way of Greater Nashua.

Region 4 (Greater Derry & Manchester): Amoskeag Health.

Region 5 (Central NH, Lakes): Granite United Way (for Central NH/Lakes region).

Region 6 (Strafford County & Seacoast): Granite United Way/United Way of the Greater Seacoast.

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Region 7 (North Country & Carroll County): Children Unlimited.
