1.	<p>Section 1. Introduction, Subsection 1.1 Purpose and Overview:</p> <p>Some of the Performance Measures' denominators, in Appendix F, reference "all patients 18 years of age and older." Are adult male patients a population covered under this RFP?</p>	<p>The intent of the funding in this solicitation is to support enhanced access to integrated primary care for the Maternal and Child Health population of Women, Infants and Children. However, it is correct that some performance measures' denominators (specifically 2.4, 2.5, 2.6 and 2.7.1), in Appendix F, also include adult males, due to national standards being used as sources for the performance measures.</p>

Scope of Services, Paragraph 3.2.6, Subparagraph 3.2.6.4:</p> <p>Regarding selected vendors providing transportation as an enabling service, can the Department clarify if the vendor must provide the transportation or whether providing support in obtaining needed transportation through referrals or other means meet the requirement?</p>	<p>Please see Addendum #1.</p>
3.	<p>Section 4. Finance, Subsection 4.2. DHHS Funding Formula:</p> <p>a. Can the Department provide a funding range for the anticipated contract award amounts?</p> <p>b. Are selected vendors required to provide care via a mobile health unit in addition to a permanent site?</p>	<p>a. No, as the Department funding formula for award amounts is dependent on the number of selected vendors.</p> <p>b. No, a mobile health unit is not a requirement. Please see Paragraph 3.2.4 of the RFP, which specifies services will be provided in an office-based setting, which may include but is not limited to, Mobile Care Delivery Services.</p>

Procurement Timetable</p> <p>Please clarify and define the questions due in #3 of the Procurement Timetable, and the questions included throughout Section 3, Statement of Work, of the RFP, and their respective due dates.</p>	<p>#3 of the Procurement Timeline is the due date (1/27/22) for Vendors to submit inquiries/questions requesting clarification of RFP content and/or requirements.</p> <p>#4 of the Procurement Timetable is the date (2/10/22) the Department anticipates publishing responses to Vendor inquiries/questions, requesting clarification of RFP content and/or requirements, received by the due date, to the Department's RFP web page. However, Department responses may be published sooner if available.</p> <p>Proposers must provide responses to all Vendor Questions included in Section 3. Statement of Work, within their Technical Proposal submission. (Also see Question 5 below.)</p>

Proposal Narrative, Project Approach and Technical Response, Subparagraph 7.2.5.1:</p> <p>Can the Department clarify what vendors must submit in accordance with Subparagraph 7.2.5.1, compared to 7.2.12 Required Attachments, 7.2.12.1.1 <u>Answers to questions in Section 3, Statement of Work?</u></p>	<p>7.2.5.1 and 7.2.12.1.1 both refer to Vendors' responses to the six (6) Vendor Questions included in Section 3 of the RFP. Vendors' responses to the questions must be included as part of the overall Proposal Narrative and Approach within the Technical Proposal submission; and/or may be included separately as an Attachment to the Technical Proposal submission.</p>
6.	<p>General Question:</p> <p>Is this RFP for the same or similar services my organization always takes part in?</p>	<p>Historically, the Department has published an RFP to support access to integrated primary care, statewide. The title of the RFP changed from "Primary Care & Primary Care for the Homeless" to "Maternal and Child Health Care in the Integrated Primary Care Setting," of which the</p>

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		objective and funding are for increased access to integrated primary care for women, infants, children and adolescents.
