



## ADDENDUM #2

RGA-2024-DLTSS-01-INTEN

Intensive Treatment Services Housing and Homelessness Initiative

On May 9, 2023 the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services published a Request for Grant Applications, soliciting applications from qualified provider organizations to purchase, renovate and/or construct housing and/or increase capacity at existing homes for individuals with a Developmental Disability or Acquired Brain Disorder who are receiving services under the 1915c waiver, and for individuals, or families who have an individual that meet the needs-based Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) eligibility requirements:.

The Department is publishing this addendum to:

**1. Delete and replace Section 1, Purpose and Overview, Subsection 1.5, Grant Agreement Requirements-Intensive Treatment Services, Paragraph 1.5.1, Subparagraph 1.5.1.3, with the following:**

1.5.1.3. Maintain licensure and certification as appropriate based on the number of individuals in the home for the required ***eight (8)*** year period.

**2. Delete and replace Section 1, Purpose and Overview, Subsection 1.5, Grant Agreement Requirements-Intensive Treatment Services, Paragraph 1.5.4, with the following:**

1.5.4. Selected Applicants must own, maintain, and utilize the property in the name of the Grantee for the original ***authorized*** purpose for a period of not less than ***eight (8)*** years from the date the property is placed in service, or must provide a lease agreement that is effective for a period of no less than for a period of not less than ***eight (8)*** years from the date the property is placed in service, and must:

1.5.4.1. Demonstrate the ability to provide ITS services at the property;

1.5.4.2. Complete environmental modifications as needed in the property in order to support the specialized clinical and medical needs of the population;

1.5.4.3. Present their plan to minimize community impact, and to both reduce and safely respond to behavioral incidents; and

1.5.4.4. Present their plan to maintain the property in continuous service for the ***eight (8)*** year period.
